

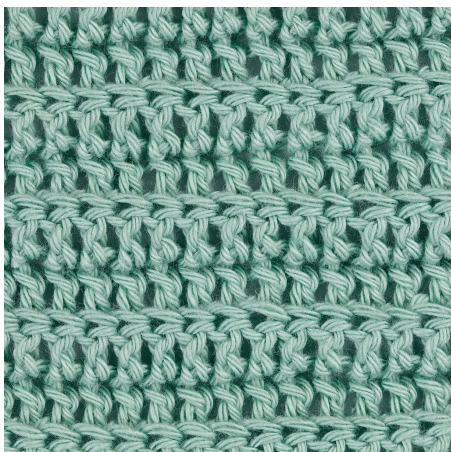


## A crocheted Dishcloth in a Ribbing Style Pattern

v15514

This crocheted dishcloth in a ribbing style pattern measures 20 x 20 cm. We have used cotton yarn 8/4 on No. 3 crochet hook. Crocheting dishcloths is a manageable project and good for the environment.

### *Comment faire*



**A tip!** In order for the dishcloths to keep the colours from fading, you may soak them in cold water adding a small amount of white vinegar. This should also improve their absorbency.

**3** Wash the dishcloths before use at 40°C.

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## A TIP!

In order for the dishcloths to keep the colours from fading, you may soak them in cold water with a small amount of white vinegar. This should also improve their absorbency.

Wash the dishcloths before use.

You will need 16 g of yarn for a 20 x 20 cm dishcloth

## How to crochet the dishcloth:

Chain 36 stitches + 1 turning chain.

Row 1: crochet this row using dc

Row 2: Turn with 2 cs (these replace the first basic treble stitch). Crochet treble crochet stitches by crocheting 1 bs in 3 cs in the back chain loop. Crochet bs in the back chain loops until the end of the row, however, crochet the last stitch of this row through both chain loops as this results in a prettier/nicer border. Repeat row 2 until the dishcloth measures 20 cm.

Row 3: Turn with with 1 cs. Continue with dc till the end of the row.



## Abbreviations and symbols explanation:

Cs = chain stitch

Dc = Double crochet stitch

Bs = Basic treble stitch
