

A hat knitted with a twist cable pattern and a pom-pom

Knit this hat with a twist cable pattern and a pom-pom. This is an ideal project for learning how to make twist cables in the round. It is knitted with maxi wool yarn on double pointed sock knitting needles. You will need 2 balls of wool (120 g) for the hat and the pom-pom.

2 Finish by securing the ends.



3 Make a pom-pom by winding the yarn around the widest of the two forks of the pom-pom tool. The more rounds you wind, the denser the pom-pom. Tie a piece of yarn around the winding. Tighten tightly and secure with a knot. Cut open both sides of the pom-pom and trim with a pair of scissors for an even round ball.



4 Tie the pom-pom onto the top of the hat with the two yarn ends used for tying the pom-pom. Thread each end onto a needle and push the needle through from the outside onto inside of the hat (don't push the needle into the same place but leave a couple of stitches between). Tie a double knot and secure the ends.





A hat knitted with a twist cable pattern

This hat with a twist cable pattern is knitted with maxi wool yarn using No. 5 mm and No. 6 mm double pointed sock knitting needles. This project is ideal for learning how to knit twist cables in the round. You will need 2 balls of wool (120 g) for the hat and the pom-pom.

One size for adults

You will need 100 g of wool for the hat without a pom-pom or 120 g of wool for the hat with a pom-pom.

Knitting needles: No. 5 mm + 6 mm double pointed sock knitting needles

- 1. Cast on 88 stitches on No. 5 double pointed sock knitting needles using maxi wool yarn. Distribute the stitches on 3 or 4 knitting needles and k2, p2 for 6 cm in the round.
- 2. Change to No. 6 double pointed sock knitting needles and increase to 110 stitches whilstknitting *p1, k1, p1, k6*. Repeat from * to * for 3 rnds.
- 3. Knit as follows in the 4th rnd: *p1, k1, p1, and knit the twist cable from the next 6stitches as follows: slip 3 stitches onto a cable needle in front of your knitting, knit 3stitches, knit the 3 stitches from the cable needle*. Continue this pattern until the end ofthe rnd.
- 4. Knit 6 rnds *p1, k1, p1, k6*. Repeat from * to *
- 5. On the 7th rnd, make the cable twist as follows: *p1, k1, p1, and knit the cable from thenext 6 stitches as follows: slip 3 stitches onto a cable needle in front of your knitting,knit 3 stitches, knit the 3 stitches from the cable needle*. Continue this pattern until theend of the rnd
- 6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 and make a total of 6 cable twists lengthwise.
- 7. Cast off over the next 5 rnds by knitting 2 tog. Pull the yarn through the last stitches and secure the yarn on the inside of the hat.
- 8. Make a pom-pom for the hat on the pom-pom tool. Make a pom-pom by winding theyarn around the widest of the two forks of the pom-pom tool. The more rounds youwind, the denser the pom-pom. Tie a single knot around the winding with a piece ofyarn. Cut open one side of the pom-pom and tighten the string tightly. Tie another knotand cut open the other side. Trim the pom-pom for an even round ball.



Abbreviations and symbols explanation:

St = stitch

K = knit

P = purl

* = repeat from *to* Rnd(s) = round(s)

tog = together
